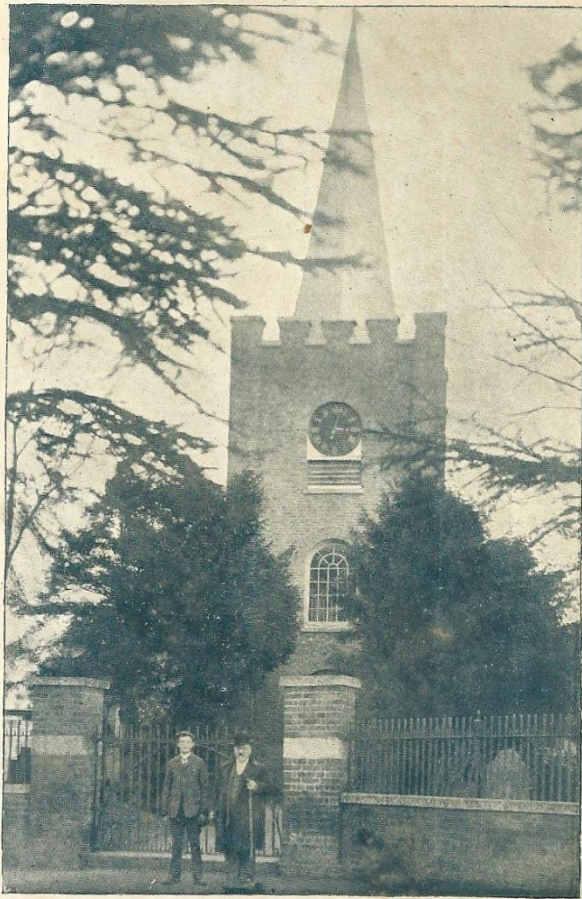
James Marshall gave an update on the group's commemorative event on the WW1.
